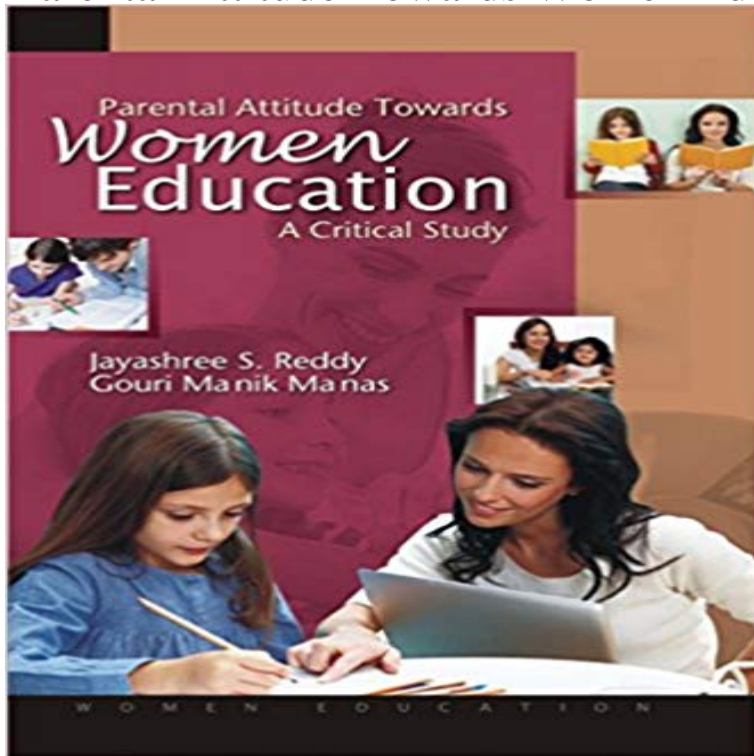


# Parental Attitude Towards Women Education: A Critical Study
